**HIB** means any gesture, any written, verbal or physical act, or any electronic communication, whether it be a single incident or series of incidents, that:

✓ Is reasonably perceived as being motivated by any actual or perceived characteristic, such as race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, or a mental, physical or sensory disability, or by any other distinguishing characteristic.

#### **AND**

✓ Takes place on school property, at any school-sponsored function, or off school grounds as provided for in *N.J.S.A.* 18A:37-15.3.

#### <u>AND</u>

✓ Substantially disrupts or interferes with the orderly operation of the school or the rights of other students.

#### AND MUST MEET ONE (or more) OF THE FOLLOWING:

•A reasonable person should know, under the circumstances, will have the effect of physically or emotionally harming a student or damaging the student's property, or placing a student in reasonable fear of physical or emotional harm to his person or damage to his property.

#### OR

• Has the effect of insulting or demeaning any student or group of students.

#### <u>OR</u>

•Creates a hostile educational environment for the student by interfering with a student's education or by severely or pervasively causing physical or emotional harm to the student.

\*Each Core Element receives score based on sum of ratings for all indicators within a core element.

# Submitting the Data

- The overall grade for each school is reported as the sum of the subtotals of the 8 core elements compared to the sum of the maximum score of 78.
- Principal submits all ratings and final score to NJDOE
- NJDOE calculates the average of total scores from all schools in district.

- Statement of Assurances and School Self Assessment to NJDOE through NJ Homeroom prior to October 31, 2019.
- Wait for 2018-19 District Score to be released (Note: 17-18 final scoring was released on 6/19/19)
  - $\checkmark$  2012 2013 = 66/75
  - $\checkmark$  2013 2014 = 71/78
  - $\checkmark$  2014 2015 = 73/78
  - $\checkmark$  2015 2016 = 70/78
  - $\checkmark$  2016 2017 = 71/78
  - $\checkmark$  2017 2018 = 75/78
  - ✓ 2018 2019 = estimating between a 75 or 76 out of 78 total points.
